In this second seminar, we focus on the challenges and opportunities of artistic planning. The program leaves time to plenum sessions, group sessions, mentor/mentee time and networking.

Tuesday evening we will watch the premiere of Crooners by NIE Theatre at Teater Manu. Teater Manu is the only professional theater that has sign language as a stage language in Norway, and the Janne Langaas, director, will introduce Teater Manu before the performance. The performance is a part of Showbox - Performing Arts Festival for young Audiences, and therefore this show will not be translated into sign language.

At your request, NTLR has prepared a set of one-pagers of the financial support structures in Denmark, Norway, Finland and Sweden.
